Detailed Description of the Side Event

Scaling Sustainable Baking: The Bigoven Solution for Job Creation, Economic Growth, and Environmental Resilience

Covens Clean Cooking Co. Limited introduces the Bigoven, a locally manufactured baking oven in Uganda that revolutionizes clean cooking by combining electric and wood energy, requiring only 25% of the firewood used by traditional kilns.

Available in domestic to industrial sizes, the Bigoven offers faster baking execution and has been successfully adopted in Uganda (Kampala, Kitgum, Masaka, Kakumiro, Mbarara) and East Africa (Rwanda, Malawi, DRC, Sudan). Bread, cakes, and cookies—staples in Sub-Saharan households—drive demand for such innovations, yet unsustainable firewood reliance threatens forests and livelihoods.

This side event will showcase the Bigoven as a scalable, science-based solution that aligns with the ARFSD 2025 theme, "Driving job creation and economic growth through sustainable, inclusive, science-and evidence-based solutions for the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063". It connects directly to SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), SDG 13 (Climate Action), and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals), while supporting Agenda 2063's vision of sustainable industrialization and people-driven development.

- 2. **Share Evidence:** Present data and testimonials from its adoption across East Africa, illustrating economic benefits (job creation in manufacturing and baking) and environmental gains (reduced deforestation).
- 3. **Build Partnerships:** Facilitate collaboration among governments, private sector, and civil society to finance and scale the Bigoven, strengthening SDG 17's focus on global partnerships.
- 4. **Influence Policy:** Propose actionable recommendations for integrating clean cooking technologies into national strategies, contributing to the Kampala Declaration.

Event Structure

Opening (10 min): The CEO of Covens Clean Cooking Co. Limited will introduce the Bigoven, sharing its journey from concept to regional success and its alignment with ARFSD goals.

Presentation (20 min): A technical expert will detail the Bigoven's hybrid energy system, showcasing data: e.g., a medium-sized unit bakes 160 loaves in 45 minutes versus 90 minutes for traditional ovens, using 5 kg of firewood instead of 20 kg. Success stories from Uganda and Rwanda will underscore its impact.
