CONCEPT NOTE

1. Introduction

Disasters caused by natural and man-made hazards have a significant impact on societies and economies worldwide. The ability to understand, monitor, and respond to these events is crucial for effective disaster risk management and mitigation efforts. Disaster-related statistics plays an important role in informing decision-making, formulating policies, and allocating resources for disaster prevention, preparedness and response. However, there is often a disconnect between the producers of this data, such as statisticians, and the users, including policymakers, researchers, and practitioners. Establishing a platform where producers and users can come together to exchange knowledge, share experiences, and collaborate on improving the quality and accessibility of disaster-related statistics is essential. Developing disaster statistics and risk metrics will not only support evidence-based policy and decision making, but also improve monitoring and reporting of progress towards internationally agreed goals and targets including the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, Agenda 2063, Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction and Paris Agreement on Climate Change.

An Expert Forum for Producers and Users of Disaster-related Statistics is organized every year, by the United Nations in collaboration with its partners, to advance the production and use of disaster-related statistics for risk-informed development in support of the aim of the Inter-Agency and Expert Group on Disaster-related Statistics (IAEG-DRS) of the United Nations Statistical Commission. The Forum provides a platform where users and producers of disaster-related statistics collaborate and share knowledge. Previous forums were organized and hosted by United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and Pacific (2023)¹, United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (2022)², United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (2021)³.

The 2024 Expert Forum for Producers and Users of Disaster-related Statistics will be organized in **Addis Ababa, Ethiopia**, back-to-back with the Statistical Commission for

Africa (STATCOM) and the United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management for Africa (UN-GGIM: Africa), from **28 October to 01 November 2024**.

2. Objectives

The main objectives of the 2024 Expert Forum are to

- a) provide a platform to discuss and exchange knowledge among stakeholders involved in the production and use of disaster-related statistics;
- b) inform about recent developments relevant for the production of disaster-related statistics, such as the ongoing review of the UNDRR/ISC hazard information profiles and other related work by regional and international organisations (e.g. WHO, WMO);
- c) identify important emerging areas of work which should be considered in the work programme of the IAEG-DRS;
- d) formulate conclusions and recommendations for improving statistical frameworks and methodologies for disaster-related statistics, in particular for the development of the Global Framework on Disaster-related Statistics.

The specific objectives are to:

- Identify and discuss the needs for disaster-related statistics and explore strategies to meet such needs given the urgent need to effectively implement and accelerate progress towards achievements of the goals of key global and regional frameworks including the 2030 Agenda, the second ten-year Plan of implementation of Agenda 2063, the Sendai Framework, the Paris Agreement, Early Warnings for All, and African Union Climate Change and Resilient Development Strategy and Action Plan (2022-2032)
- Facilitate dialogue and knowledge exchange among statisticians, policymakers, researchers, and practitioners involved in disaster risk management
- Share and discuss best practices, methodologies, and innovative approaches used and adopted at national, regional and international level for collecting, analysing, and disseminating disaster-related statistics
- Share and discuss country experiences and best practices in the production of disaster-related statistics
- Share and discuss country experiences and best practices in the utilization of disaster-related statistics to monitor national and global disaster risk reduction commitments or guide risk-informed development.

3. Expected Outcomes:

- Identify challenges and gaps in existing statistical frameworks to improve disaster-related data collection, standardization, and harmonization
- Identify priority needs of countries to inform capacity development and technical support
- Identify regional and international guidelines and indicators in the production of disaster-related statistics to be replicated and adopted by the nations.
- Identification of best practices and innovative approaches in data collection, analysis, dissemination and use
- Promote collaborations and partnerships between producers and users of disaster-related statistics for evidence-based decision-making
- Enhance the capacity and skills of stakeholders in generating, interpreting, and utilizing disaster-related statistics
- Recommendations for improving statistical frameworks and methodologies for disaster-related statistics.

4. Audience

The Expert Forum will invite participation from governments, academia, NGOs, the private sector, international organizations, and champion experts, that are involved in the utilization and production of disaster-related statistics, including statisticians, disaster risk management experts, geospatial scientists, as well as policy and decision makers.

5. Organizing Partners

The Expert Forum organizing partners include African Center for Statistics (ACS) and Technology, Climate Change and Natural Resources Development (TCND) of ECA, African Union Commission (AUC), United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR), United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD), United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and UN regional commissions: Economic and Social Commission for Asia and Pacific (ESCAP), Economic Commission for Europe (ECE), Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA), and Economic Commission for Latin America and Caribbean (ECLAC).

Day 3	Session 5: Strengthening Capacity and Resource	<p>This session will adopt a workshop format to organize three parallel sessions on capacity development and resources, informed by prior sessions and outcome of previous forums. Considering capacity needs, enabling environments, data ecosystem maturity differs greatly for the three key dimensions on disaster related statistics, the breakout/parallel sessions looking at risk information; disaster impact; and DRR expenditure.</p> <p>Across all 3 dimensions, the sessions will look at core issues related to capacity needs and resources required for producing and applying data, data governance related capacity development needs.</p> <p>The scope of resource encompasses financing and funding mechanism, capacity development (capacity need assessment and monitoring tools, technical assistance, peer learning, job shadowing, mentoring, and training), standards, guidance and templates, technology and innovation to support production and use of disaster-related statistics</p>
