

# Interactive Dashboards Navigation



The intention of a **Rapid Gender Assessment-2**, is to provide an in depth analysis of the gender disaggregated data to understand the different needs, priorities, coping strategies, risk and insecurities and vulnerabilities of the conflict, considering different gender roles and responsibilities and intersectionality factors to inform an equitable and effective humanitarian response and give recommendations for gender-sensitive humanitarian programmes, that prompt justice and equality women, men, boy and girls of all ages, statues, and vulnerabilities.

#### Situation in Sudan

The current conflict started on the 15th of April 2023 with clashes between the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) and the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) in Khartoum and spread to regions of Darfur, Merawi, Al Geneina, and Kordofan. The fighting has continued for weeks, resulting in the killings of people, and the destruction of infrastructure - including roads, hospitals, schools, and private and public offices and people's houses. Most people have been forced to flee to safe areas inside Sudan and outside of Sudan. Currently, thousands of IDPs are hosted by host families, especially in the Blue Nile and the Red Sea, or in temporary shelters such as schools, clubs, and hostels among others. Families that have opted to remain in conflict areas for various reasons are in need of water, food, access to health care, and other lifesaving interventions. Due to the destruction of industries, and livelihoods, humanitarian intervention is urgently needed in conflict areas.
