











# African Islands: Transitioning towards a climate smart and resilient future

#### COP 26 Side Event

November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021 – 14-16h (TBC) African Pavilion, Blue Zone, Glasgow

#### **Abstract**

Island nations are undertaking significant efforts to cope with the challenges of climate change, adapt their economies and mitigate the risks posed by their limited land resources, extreme multi-hazards exposure and vulnerable social conditions. This side event gathers climate champions from the Small Island Developing States in the African continent to discuss solutions that are being implemented for a just transition towards a net zero economy based on green and blue growth.

The event proposes two high-level panels. The first one includes presidents and ministers from African Island nations to discuss their innovative actions to bringing new solutions that contribute to consolidate climate resilience and sustainable development, in the framework of a just transition for SIDS nations. The second panel comprises leaders from international development partners to share initiatives being implemented that contribute to foster climate resilience and bring innovative avenues to advance a climate smart and resilient agenda to build forward better and assure that the SIDS are not leave behind

Recently SIDS and African nations launched the Santa Maria Call to Action demanding for greater support for a just transition, in the context of the Samoa Pathway, the African Union Agenda 2063 and the Sustainable Development Goals.

New opportunities emerging such as the potential of the oceans and the green and blue economy, the debt swap for climate projects, carbon markets or the green and blue bonds will be discussed as strategies to consolidate long-term sustainable development and reduce islands dependency on external support. The event will show how SIDS are working to harness these resources and ensure informed dynamic policy and decision making for a low emission climate-resilient development pathway.
