- ▶ Dateline: 2004 MALARIA DEATHS AND DDT
- ► MoH: Refused with statistics on deaths and hospital bed occupancy related to Malaria.
- ► MoE: Gimmicks: Tossed from one office to another on DDT usage for Malaria control and environmental effects.
- ▶ NEMA: Never responded to the questionnaire sent on DDT usage in Kenya (How much tonnage/Where it was being used?)
- ▶ KNBS: Could not comment on other ministries functions.
- ► WITH ALL SOURCES OF PRIMARY DATA CLOSED WHERE DO I TÚRN TO?

Dateline: 2010 – Good for Africa, Bad for America": Obsolete Chemicals Dumped in Africa

MoH: No comment from Health Headquarters' on Furadan imports

PCPB: Asked for questionnaire. They never responded after questionnaire was submitted.

KWS: No comment even on reported wildlife deaths from usage of obsolete chemicals

NEMA: No comment.

KNBS: Could not comment on other ministries functions and could not release any data


- ►Dateline: 2014 Africa Loses out on Oceans
